MARC BORNSTEIN, P h. D.

Senior Investigator and Head of Child and Family Research at the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development, Dr. Bornstein has exhibited considerable dedication to advancing positive child development. He has contributed scientific papers in the areas of human experimental, methodological, comparative, developmental, cross-cultural, neuroscientific, and aesthetic psychology. Dr. Bornstein is editor emeritus of *Child Development* and editor of *Parenting: Science and Practice*.

ROBERT BRADLEY, P h. D.

A professor in the Center for Applied Studies in Education at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock and a committed researcher, Dr. Bradley's areas of focus are socioeconomic status as it relates to parenting issues, child development, developmental and cultural issues, resiliency attitudes in high-risk adolescents, child care and youth development, and low-income fathers. Dr. Bradley is the President of the Southwestern Society for Research in Human Development (2000-2002).

KEITH CRNIC, P h. D.

Currently the head of the Department of Psychology at Pennsylvania State University and a published authority on child well-being, Dr. Crnic's research interests center around family processes that influence the trajectory of young children's development. Stress in the parenting context, parent-child interaction, co-parenting processes, and affective processes in family relationships are among the major areas of his research.

ELLEN GALINSKY

President and Co-Founder of Families and Work Institute and the author of the book, *Ask the Children*, Ms. Galinsky is a leading authority on work-family issues. The author of over 20 books and reports, including *The Six Stages of Parenthood* and *The Preschool Years*, coauthored with Judy Davis, she has published more than 100 articles in academic journals, academic books, and magazines.

MARY JUZANG, E d. S.

The Director of the After School Learning Center, Excel Educational Enterprises, Ms. Juzang develops and administers academic curriculum and activities for African American and other minority youth. For more than 35 years, she has worked extensively as an educator, providing both experience and service to the youth and adult populations in her community.

JEROME KAGAN, P h. D.

Dr. Kagan has been studying human development since 1964 and is one of the most respected scholars in the areas of children's cognitive, social, and emotional development. Dr. Kagan was a professor of psychology at Harvard University for 36 years and has received many honors including the distinguished scientist award from the Society for Research in Child Development. He has edited and authored many texts on child psychology, including *Galen's Prophecy: Temperament in Human Nature* and *Three Seductive Ideas*.

RICHARD LERNER, P h. D.

Dr. Lerner is the Bergstrom Chair in Applied Developmental Sciences at Tufts University. As a developmental psychologist, he is known for his work in relations between life-span human development and contextual or ecological change. He has done foundational studies of adolescent relations with their peers, family, school, and community, and is a leader in the study of public policies and community-based programs aimed at the promotion of positive youth development.

VELMA MCBRIDE MURRY, P h. D.

Dr. Murry is associate professor of child and family development and Co-Director of the Center of Family Research in the Institute for Behavioral Research at the University of Georgia. Her research interests include family process, family stress, coping and adaptation, human sexuality, and family resiliency and strengths among African Americans.

CAMILLE SMITH, M. S., E d. S.

Ms. Smith is a developmental psychologist in the Child Development Studies Section of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. She is involved in implementing Legacy for Children, a randomized clinical trial designed to assess if and by how much parents can be encouraged in ways that may positively alter the developmental trajectory of their high-risk children.

LAURENCE STEINBERG, P h. D.

Dr. Steinberg is the Distinguished University Professor and Laura H. Carnell Professor of Psychology at Temple University. A nationally recognized expert on psychological development and family relations during adolescence, Dr. Steinberg's research has focused on a range of topics in the study of contemporary adolescence, including parent-adolescent relationships, adolescent employment, high school reform, and juvenile crime and justice.
